ARRIVING IN THE PHILIPPINES GUIDE FOR FOREIGN NATIONALS

REQUIREMENTS

ARRIVALS THROUGH 9A VISA:

- Fully Vaccinated
- Proof of Vaccination
 - World Health Organization International Certificate of Vaccination and Prophylaxis
 - VaxCertPH
 - National/State Digital Certificate of the following [countries](#)
 - Other proofs of vaccination permitted by the IATF
- No facility-based quarantine required
- Self-monitor for any sign or symptom until the 7th day from arrival
- Unvaccinated Foreign Nationals are not allowed to enter the country.
- If proof of vaccination is unacceptable:
 - Facility-based quarantine until the release of the negative results
 - 5th day swabbing
 - Self-monitor for any sign or symptom until the 14th day from arrival

ARRIVALS UNDER VISA FREE STATUS:

- Fully Vaccinated, except for minors below 12 years old
- Proof of Vaccination
 - World Health Organization International Certificate of Vaccination and Prophylaxis
 - VaxCertPH
 - National/State Digital Certificate of the following [countries](#)
 - Other proofs of vaccination permitted by the IATF
- Negative RT-PCR test result within 48 hours prior to departure
- Valid return tickets to the original port of origin or next port of destination not more than 30 days from the date of arrival in the Philippines. *Exemptions are:*
 - Foreign spouses and/or children of Filipino Citizens
 - Former Filipino Citizens (Balikbayan) under Republic Act 9174. Including spouse and/or children who are not balikbayans in their own right
- Valid passport for at least 6 months on the time of arrival in PH
- Travel Insurance for COVID-19 treatment with minimum coverage of USD35,000

ARRIVALS FROM OTHER TYPES OF VISA:

- Fully Vaccinated
- Proof of Vaccination
 - World Health Organization International Certificate of Vaccination and Prophylaxis
 - VaxCertPH
 - National/State Digital Certificate of the following [countries](#)
 - Other proofs of vaccination permitted by the IATF
- No facility-based quarantine required
- Self-monitor for any sign or symptom until the 14th day from arrival
- Unvaccinated Foreign Nationals are not allowed to enter the country.
- If proof of vaccination is unacceptable:
 - Facility-based quarantine until the release of the negative results
 - 5th day swabbing
 - Self-monitor for any sign or symptom until the 14th day from arrival

BEFORE THE FLIGHT

- Register for *One Health Pass* and save the *unique transaction number* once registration is complete.
- Use the *One Health Pass* number to accomplish the *Health Declaration Certificate (e-HDC)*. Save a copy of the QR (*digital or printed*). Register as early as 3 days prior your departure date.
- Download the *TRAZE* mobile app and complete registration. The app will provide a *unique QR code* to utilize in any of the Philippine airports.

DURING THE FLIGHT

- Accomplish the *Bureau of Customs Form* and *Arrival Card* which are distributed during your flight.
- Ensure you have a copy of your *One Health Pass QR code*.

ARRIVAL PROCEDURES

- Undergo a temperature check, and proceed to the designated waiting area.
- If required, present your negative RT-PCR test result taken within the prescribed period prior to your departure and proof of vaccination to the dedicated Bureau of Quarantine (BOQ) representative for re-verification at the Department of Transportation One-Stop-Shop (OSS).
- Clear with immigration and submit the Arrival Card.
- Claim your baggage at the designated carousel and clear with Customs Check. Submit the Bureau of Customs Form.

NOTE: Due to the pandemic, travel restrictions and procedures may change frequently. Kindly check with your Marsman contact for the latest regulations should you have immediate travel plans.
